CLASSIZOOM CE Procedures

<u>Daily Supplies</u> - Your child must have the yellow "take home" folder, the red "school" folder, pencil case with pencils, crayons, markers, 1 glue stick, scissors, a dry-erase marker and headphones in their backpacks. Please be sure to check our weekly "Class News" to see additional weekly items to bring. Please make sure your supplies are labeled with your child's name. Some of these supplies will stay in their book bins in the classroom.

Reader's Chair — Each student will have a chance to read to the class a few times throughout the school year and become the teacher by asking questions about his/her book. Please be sure the book chosen can be read with minimal assistance. It is important to practice this book at home with your child. It will make him/her feel more at ease while reading to the class. The book should not take more than about 10 to 15 minutes to read.

<u>Star of the Week</u> — Each student will get a chance to be "The Star of the Week." You will receive a form to fill out and you may make a poster with your child to share with the class.

CLASS POMENTIPS for Technology Poccedures

<u>Clever</u>: In order to access Seesaw, iXL, Studies Weekly, and Wixie your student must login through Clever. Clever can be accessed using this link: <u>clever.com/in/d142</u>.

<u>Seesaw:</u> When your student is using Seesaw, they must log into Clever and click on Seesaw. It will then direct them to the Seesaw App. There are two versions of the app. The app needed to upload student work is called **Seesaw Class**. Parents must also join **Seesaw Family**. An email invite to Seesaw Family will be sent out to you.

<u>iXL</u>: To complete activities on iXL language arts and math you must select level D or 2nd Grade. Once you select level D or 2nd Grade you will be able to see the categories listed on the lessons that were sent out.

Epic: To access Epic use this link: <u>getepic.com/students</u>. You must log in using your class code. We will notify you of the class code. Students can go to the mailbox to find assigned books.

<u>Studies Weekly:</u> To access Studies Weekly, you need to login through Clever. Once logged in, Click Studies Weekly. This will give you different grades, so you need to click on Second Grade Studies Weekly. From there, you can click on the specific week/article that is assigned.


